OCTOBER PRAYER DIARY

Prayer topics are arranged over seven days which you may find helpful.

Sunday

Pray for Tom, Colin & Louise & for their pastoral role in the life of the congregation & also for their work in the community. Pray for Louise as she leaves us at the end of October. Pray that she may find a suitable appointment for ministry. Pray for Russell & Margaret as they continue with their many public engagements.

Monday

Pray for a resolution to the conflict in Syria, particularly for humanitarian aid to reach the city of Aleppo. Pray for those families who have been bereaved in recent atrocities & for medical personnel attempting to cope with mass casualties.

Tuesday

Pray for the ministry of the choir & for Alistair as he leads them. Pray for Italian earthquake survivors that they may be in sheltered accommodation before cold weather comes.

Wednesday

(from the Christian Aid Website)

Pray for our Zimbabwean partners Open Schools Worldwide & Christian Care, which are working together to help children excluded from school to gain an education. Pray for volunteers, in partnership with local child protection committees, delivering learning materials using a 'School-in-a-Bag'. Pray that these packages, which contain teachers' guides, audio materials & teaching equipment, children's workbooks & lap-desks, will transform the lives of those they reach. Ask God to bless the training, support & quality control of volunteers.

Thursday

(from The Church of Scotland website)

UK Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson has been urged to take action to try & stop Christians in Pakistan being kidnapped & forced to convert to Islam. Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland Right Rev Dr Russell Barr said the practice was a crime but not one that was properly investigated to bring the perpetrators to justice. He said the growing threat to the safety & security of non-Muslims in Pakistan was making the lives of minorities increasingly difficult & called on the Foreign Secretary to raise the issue with the country's government as a matter of urgency. Pray for the Church in Pakistan as it faces up to this threat.

Friday

Pray for the work of Fresh Start - food from the Harvest Thanksgiving Service on 2 October will be given to the ministry of Fresh Start. Pray for The Scottish Churches Housing Action group which is hosting a conference on 7 October; this year's theme is "Homelessness in Scotland: the challenges of uncertainty" & the guest speakers will be the Rt Revd Dr Russell Barr & Kevin Stewart MSP.

Saturday

(from the Christian Aid website)

On World Food Day, 16 October, pray for the people of Haiti, where a third year of drought has driven people deeper into poverty & hunger & doubled the number of people who do not have a secure supply of food. Pray for our partner MISSEH (the Social Mission of Haitian Churches), seeking to provide cash & staple food items to 500 vulnerable households alongside seeds & agricultural tools to 700 families.

REFLECTION

Jesus further invites the weary: "Take my yoke upon you & learn from me; for I am gentle & humble in heart & you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy & my burden is light" (Matthew 11 : 29 - 30). The yoke was a familiar symbol of burden bearing, oppression & subjugation. Yokes were laid on the necks & shoulders of oxen & also on prisoners of war & slaves. What is the yoke Jesus offers? We might infer that it is his teaching, his way of discipleship, which is not burdensome but life-giving. He invites the weary to learn from him, for he is not a tyrant who lords it over his disciples, but is "gentle & humble in heart." His yoke is easy (chrestos, better translated "good" or "kind") & his burden is light. To take his yoke upon oneself is to be yoked to the one in whom God's kingdom of justice, mercy & compassion is breaking into this world & to find the rest for which the soul longs....

It is not that Jesus invites us to a life of ease. Following him will be full of risks & challenges as he has made abundantly clear. He calls us to a life of humble service but it is a life of freedom & joy instead of slavery. It is life yoked to Jesus under God's gracious & merciful reign, free from the burden of sin & the need to prove oneself, free to rest deeply & securely in God's grace.
