#### WEDNESDAY

Living Lent, the cross-denominational Lent initiative from the Joint Public Issues Team, is back for another year. Running throughout the 40 days of Lent, from Wednesday, 26 February until Thursday, 9 April, Living Lent invites us to re-evaluate our lifestyles & the impact on the climate. Pray for our world, that we may care for God's creation in our daily lives.

## **THURSDAY**

Pray for Christian Aid as they lobby the UN for a fair solution to protect & support internally displaced people around the world. Two-thirds of people forced from home are still in their own country. Seeking safety but unwilling or unable to leave, they are denied the official protection given to refugees. The reasons for their displacement are many: conflict, flooding, drought, fear. Torn from their homes, their families & their communities, displaced people are among the most vulnerable to poverty & exploitation in the world. Pray with Christian Aid that they are treated with respect & care. That all people are protected from harm & have a chance to rebuild their lives.

## **FRIDAY**

Join Fairtrade as they come together with companies & supporters to bring attention to the farmers & workers around the world, in some of the poorest countries, who grow the food we eat & make the clothes we wear. Pray especially for coco farmers who face countless challenges. Sadly, one core problem lies at the root of many of their worries, that their incomes are simply too low. Pray that more companies will see the person behind the products we use every day & will provide a fair living wage for their hard work, even if that means they make less profit themselves.

### **SATURDAY**

On 28 March the Church of Scotland is holding its first ever Violence Against Women conference in Dunblane Cathedral. Pray for the preparations, as they focus on resourcing & equipping congregations. Pray for all those who suffer at the hand of violence in their lives, that they may be broken free of it & that we may have our eyes opened to it.
